FEDERAL AND STATE CLEAN WATER ACT MANDATES MAKE THE MANDATE WORK FOR US

Mandate for Prince George's County

- Treat 15,000 impervious acres by 2025
 - ~ 46,000 stormwater filtration devices
 - Estimated cost approximately <u>\$1.2 billion</u>
- Pay for this with a dedicated funding source (Clean Water Act Fee)

The Prince George's Model:

- Revitalize older communities
- Lead with innovation
- Grow local economy
- Partner as much as possible



CLEAN WATER THROUGH RETROFITS GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE & LID BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES



INNOVATIVE FINANCING AND SERVICE DELIVERY NON POINT SOURCE "STORM" WATER INFRASTRUCTURE

- \$75.5M in Savings on first 2,000 acres of water infrastructure retrofits
 - \$60M savings against previously estimated delivery costs
 - \$15.5M savings in interest on costs of financing
- Project Aggregation with a Integrated Design, Build and Maintain approach for greater efficiencies, sustainability, and accelerated implementation.
- Strategic cluster anchor and community infrastructure builder
- Performance based strategies directly linked to the communities long term economic and water quality goals and objectives.

Launch Public Private Partnership (P3) Model for Efficiency and Scalability to build our clean water infrastructure and green infrastructure economic cluster



INNOVATIVE FINANCING

- \$48M Debt Issuance from the Maryland Water Quality State Revolving Loan Fund.
- \$1.5M in loan forgiveness
- Significantly below market interest rates
- Leverages the partnership's delivery capabilities and water qualify fund.
 - ~1,000 acres of aggregated stormwater scope (~500 distinct projects)
- Joint application between Prince George's and Corvias, with Corvias being the private borrower.
- Improved balance sheet treatment to free credit capacity for other municipal priorities

TRANSACTION SAVINGS USING WQRLF VERSUS PUBLIC REVENUE/GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS



Prince George's County meets WQFA's Disadvantaged Community criteria

Assumptions:

Market Rate = 3.20% (Bond Buyer-11 Index at 10/2/15)

WQRLF - Standard Rate = 2.10% (50% of Market Rate + 50bps for Administative Fee)

WQRLF - Disadvantaged Community Rate = 1.30% (25% of Market Rate + 50bps for Administative Fee)

Amortization: Level Payment

Tenor: 20 years

MARYLAND'S WATER QUALITY CAPITAL FINANCING PROGRAM

- Administered under the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE), the Maryland Water Quality Financing Administration (WQFA) provides low interest loans through the Water Quality Revolving Loan Fund (WQRLF) and grants under the Bay Restoration Fund
 - Loan Amounts: Up to 100% of project cost
 - Interest Rate: *1.60% fixed (*0.70% for disadvantaged communities)
 - Administrative/Loan Fee: Collected annually, adds ~*0.35% interest
 - Tenor: Up to 30 years
 - Annual Application process
 - Projects are selected based on a priority rating system

ELIGIBLE WATER QUALITY PROJECTS

Implementation of nonpoint source pollution under Section 319 and estuary conservation and management plan under Section 320 of the Federal Clean Water Act

- Capping of Existing Landfills

- Storm water Control Best Management Practices
- Stream Restoration/ Stream Bank Stabilization
- Wetlands Creation/ Restoration
- Agricultural Best Management Practices
- Septic System Repair/ Restoration
- Replacement of Leaking Underground Storage Tanks

Note: Projects do not have to be publicly owned and are also eligible as part of a P3 and on private land, at no extra cost for the loan recipient

SELECTION

- Each eligible water quality project is evaluated using a "project score sheet" and its readiness and feasibility to execute delivery.
- Project Rating Criteria (Maximum 100 points)
 - Project Environmental Water Quality Benefit Score (Max 65 points)
 - Project Cost Efficiency (Max 10 points)
 - Sustainability Benefit Score (Max 25 points)
- But you have to have a plan and submit a application!

KEY TAKEAWAYS

- There is Low Cost Capital available!
 - Loans at below market (municipal) interest rates
- Flexible Loan Terms and structuring
 - Interest only during construction
 - First principal payment due one year after the completion of first project
 - Public and/or Private Borrowers (*Maryland)
- Ability to be Leveraged
 - Can be utilized along with other public/private sources of financing
 - Credit enhancements that lower cost of alternative private capital sources.
- Its not just about the Revenue!
 - Ability to scale and surety of execution creates greater access to capital!
